

THE VIRTUE OF GRATITUDE

Alright guys, this month we are setting our sights on practicing and living out the virtue of gratitude. That's right, we are going to concentrate on being thankful for everything in our lives. Why is that so important on this journey towards holiness? A virtuous man is a grateful man, that's why. How can he not be? Think about that. In fact, one sure sign that we are becoming virtuous is that we are humble enough to be grateful. A man full of vice and pride would never be grateful for anything because deep down he would believe the graces received either came from his own doing or he wasn't in need of them in the first place. Therefore, he is ungrateful and lacking in virtue. Venerable Fulton Sheen told us just that. He said, "Gratitude is characteristic only of the humble. The egotistical are so impressed by their own importance that they take everything given them as if it were their own due. They have no room in their hearts for recollection of the undeserved favors they received." Is this the way you have been living your life thus far? I know at one time I did, and I can tell you I was never happy.

So many of us spend our time looking at the things we have missed out on or the things we haven't gotten in life that we forget to be grateful for all the gifts we have been given. When we spend our lives this way, we fall prey to the sins of comparison and envy. We are never satisfied with what we have because we are too busy being jealous over what somebody else received. Envy and greed steal our gratitude and joy. Each of us can probably remember getting a gift as a kid only to see that someone else in the room got something better. We may have gotten the exact thing that we wished for, but in the moment we saw that someone else got something different and we quickly became ungrateful for the very thing we had asked for. How many of us with good jobs, nice houses, and beautiful families have caught ourselves pining after the life and gifts of another man? How many of us have found ourselves griping over leftovers when there are so many people going without food for weeks on end. Brothers, we will never be the joyful, virtuous men we are trying to be if this is the way we go about life. This is the Devil's hope for you. That you spend your entire life depressed and angry because you think you have been dealt a lesser hand than other people.

My brothers, in order to be joyful, holy disciples, we have to be determined to be grateful men. We have to be purposeful each and every day at looking at everything as a gift—even the bad things that happen. Why? Because suffering allows you to partake in the suffering of Christ, which is itself a gift. The fact that you wake up breathing every morning is a gift. The fact that you get to spend another day (whether sunny, rainy, or freezing) with your family is gift. Every morsel of food that the Lord provides for you is a gift. The fact that you can walk, stand, see, hear, and speak freely is a gift. Men, let's quit looking at all the things in life that we didn't get or missed out on. Let's turn our attention towards thanking God, our wives, our children, and

our neighbors for the very gifts that they are in our lives. Let us spend our time not as wanting disciples but as grateful ones. In the words of St. Ambrose, "No duty is more urgent than returning thanks." This month, I look forward to becoming a more grateful man with you on this narrow road.

WEEK 1 REFLECTION:

GRATITUDE AND GOD

You were going to hell—make no mistake about it. Due to Adam and Eve's choice in the garden and the repercussions it triggered, we were all facing eternal separation from God. At least that was the road we were headed down until God decided to give up the one thing He loved most in order to save us.

That one thing was Jesus.

He did it for you and He did it for me. I think a lot of times we forget the gravity of that decision. It's easy in the hustle and bustle of our everyday life to allow that fact to lose its meaning. John 3:16 can quickly become just another sign in the crowd at a sporting event or a group of words and numbers on the eye black of an athlete. Have we allowed this to happen in our lives? Is Holy Week—that special time when the stark reality of what Jesus went through is depicted right in front of us—the only time we find ourselves being grateful to God? My brothers, it used to be that way for me. But that was before I began to understand the virtue of gratitude and the importance it should have in my life.

St. Paul writes to the Thessalonians, "Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" (1 Thes 5:18). Brothers, we are to give thanks to God for everything in our lives. Everything that you are and everything that you have is a gift from God. Your family, your job, the things you are good at, your health, your ability to breathe, and everything in between is a gift from God. So many before us knew that. Look at St. Mary Magdalene as she washed the feet of Jesus with tears of gratitude for what He had done in her life. Look at the one leper out of 10 who returned to thank Jesus for healing him. Are we living a life in constant gratitude or are we walking away ungrateful as the other nine lepers did? That's the question we need to be asking ourselves this month. If we do not learn to be grateful for what God has done for us then we will never be joyful. We will forever be looking to fleeting things of the world for momentary brushes with happiness. If we are not joyful for the daily blessing God pours out upon us, then we will never been able to allow those blessings to overflow onto others. That's the thing: if we lack gratitude for the gifts we have been given, then we never do the one thing we are supposed to do with those gifts—which is to share them with others. Jesus asked us to love God above all. You do that well when you are grateful. He also asked us to love others. You do that by living gratefully and allowing that gratitude to burst forth and shower others around you. It is gratitude for what God has done for us that stokes the desire to tell others about Him. All of it stems from gratitude.

My brothers, this week we focus on being grateful to God because He is a good, loving Father. Because it is right and just. Start by thanking God every morning in your prayer time for giving you life, for allowing you another day with your family. End your day with thanking Him for the things that happened, good and bad. Stop counting what's missing and look at all the small blessings you have been given. A virtuous man is a grateful man. So let's get to it. Start your day off determined to live it with a grateful mindset. I'll be praying for each of you. Please pray for me.

GRATITUDE AND MY WIFE

^{*}If you are not married and do not have children, use this week to continue to grow your relationship with God and your neighbor while praying for your future spouse and children.

I would be completely lost without my wife, Angela. Let's be honest, without our wives, we'd all be lost. I'd constantly be looking for clean clothes in a pile of dirty ones. I would be living off of pizza rolls and Doritos. My kids would never be in the right place at the right time. I certainly wouldn't be in the place I am with my faith. Our wives do so much to keep our families on track, and they put up with a lot of junk from us along the way. They really are superheroes without a cape and they are such blessings in our lives.

The question is though, do we ever tell them that? I know I have caught myself many a time marveling at what a tremendous mother and wife Angela is. She works a full time job and is a full time mom and spouse. She is amazing at it even when she thinks she isn't. I know I have thought those things, but have I told her? Do we tell our wives how much we see them doing and how grateful we are for it? Or, do we go with the age old guys answer that, "they should know" we appreciate them? Every one of us likes to be thanked or to receive a word of gratitude. What makes us think our wives are any different?

So many times our spouses get what is left over from us. So many times they deal with the worst parts of us. Yet they still continue to show up. They still continue to forgive. God has truly given each one of us who has been blessed by marriage a gift. "It is not good for man to be alone," God said in Genesis 2:18. Man, was He right. So what are we going to do about it? How are we going to begin to practice and live out gratitude with our spouses? We are going to be intentional about it, that's how. You need to figure out what your wife's love language is. How does she like to be appreciated? What makes her feel loved? These are questions that we each have to care enough to find out. I know for Angela it isn't flowers or gifts. It isn't sweet nothings or lip service. It's acts of service. It's me taking the time to clean the house without being prodded. It's taking care of the little broken things around the house the first time I'm asked. It's volunteering to run the kids to all their events instead of letting her do it. Each of us has to care enough to figure out how our wives receive love and gratitude. It's through those efforts that they will feel appreciated.

So where do we start? This week, how about simply thanking God for your wife each and every morning? How about telling her how often you have neglected to let her know how much she is appreciated? Think about something you can do everyday to show her how grateful you are for her. Write her a note about all the things you are grateful for. Give her a night out with the girls. Take her on a date. Do the thing she has been after you forever to do. And no matter what you wind up doing, do it with a heart filled with gratitude. Our wives are the second most important relationship in our lives (after our relationship with God). It's time we started letting them know that by the way we treat them. Spend some time this week pondering over all the things your wife has done for you over the years. Let yourself feel the appreciation for those things. Gratitude and your wife, guys. Let's get to it.

WEEK 3 REFLECTION:

GRATITUDE AND MY CHILDREN

Angela and I have been blessed with three healthy, beautiful kids. Two of them, Allison and Katelyn, were even identical twins. Jacob, their older brother, is an amazing young man. The Lord has blessed our family tremendously with all three. I think about that often. I think about how many families are not able to physically have children. I think about how lucky we were to have three that were born perfectly healthy when so many are not. I think about how I couldn't imagine life without them. I have learned a lot of lessons being a father and I am thankful for everyone of them.

When asked who was the greatest in the kingdom of heaven, Jesus called a child over to Him and gave us the answer: children. Jesus told us that unless we become like children we will not enter the kingdom of heaven. This should be eye-opening for us. You may have heard the phrase, "the student has become the master." How true this often is in our relationship with our kids. I can't tell you how many times I have lost my temper and cussed at someone in traffic only to hear a little voice from the back seat say, "Daddy, Jesus wouldn't like that" or "Daddy that wasn't very nice." I can remember times where I was speaking uncharitably about someone and those same voices reminded me we are supposed to love everybody. I have received so many lessons in kindness, humility, forgiveness, and love from my children. They are constant reminders of the heart of Jesus, and we should be abundantly grateful for the lessons they teach us.

Much like our wives, our children can often go unappreciated. Many times, whether we want to admit it or not, our children can play second fiddle to our jobs and the busyness of life. Before long, they are older and involved in all sort of activities that run opposite to your busy work schedule. If we aren't careful, we can miss so much time with them. WEEK 4 REFLECTION:

GRATITUDE AND MY NEIGHBOR

We all know what Jesus thought about how we should treat our neighbor. He made that abundantly clear when He asked us to love our neighbor as ourselves. He also said to us, "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Mt 25:40). One of the greatest ways we can love our neighbor is to express our gratitude for them. We can be thankful for them. Our gratitude should be expressed in the way we treat them.

When was the last time you told your buddy how thankful you were for him and his presence in your life? When was the last time you looked your closest friends in the eye and told them you loved them? For some of us the answer to that question is probably never. For many men, saying those things is hard—especially when you are saying them to other men. There is an unwritten code between guys that the action of spending time with you should let you know that I am fond of you. It's that age old "I am a man and it's not manly to share things like that" type of sentiment. Well, I'd like to flip that sentiment on its head. To me, expressing your gratitude for others is one of the manliest things you can do. The vulnerability of sharing things like that with other men is often times one of the greatest gifts you can give another man. You not only share your appreciation and gratitude, but more often than not you open a door that had been barred shut in their life as well. In your vulnerable gratitude, you share a life lesson with your brother.

Gratitude towards others is sort of a lost art in today's world. So many people would love nothing more in their jobs and in their lives than to be appreciated. So many would like their efforts and their work to be humbly acknowledged. Just think about it. When is the last time you heard someone at work tell you you did a great job? When is the last time you told the bagger at the grocery store, "thank you"? When is the last time you saw a police officer or a fireman and thanked them for keeping your family safe? Have you ever taken a minute after Mass and thanked your priest for giving his life to the service of God and your family? We can spread so much good will, joy, and happiness just by taking a few minutes out of our day to go out of our way and say thank you to those around us. We all know what it feels like when people share words of gratitude with us or point out a difference we have made in their life. Take that familiar feeling and realize what a constant difference you could make in the lives of others by sharing that same blessing. This is something powerful and easy to do that would make an instant impact in the world.

My brothers, this week we are focusing our efforts to do just that. We need to have our radar up for opportunities to express our gratitude to those around us. No one is off the table. There should be ample opportunities each hour of the day to thank everyone around you. Just think of it as your 10 foot circle. People of all walks of life and circumstances will come in and out of that circle all day long. Look for ways this week to share a word of thanks and gratitude to those folks. Pray for them. Give them a fist bump or an "atta boy." Whatever you do, spend this week being aware of the blessing people are in your life and make sure and thank them for it.

That You are my Lord and my God,


Jesus, I trust in you.
