

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### WELCOME

#### Brothers in Christ,

I am so excited to deliver this resource to you. As I look back over the years at what God has had us doing at Just a Guy in the Pew, it has become obvious that His goal for our ministry is to help men become virtuous. Jesus didn't ask us to be merely "good" men, no He called us to be great men. In order for this to happen we need to leave vice and selfishness behind and trade it in for virtue and selflessness. That is what will help us achieve the goal that Christ has for us all. That goal is holiness. In the words of St. Gregory of Nyssa, "The goal of a virtuous life is to become like God." What is God? He is holy and that's what we should hope to become as well.

The Catechism defines virtue in this way: "A virtue is a habitual and firm disposition to do the good. It allows the person not only to perform good acts, but to give the best of himself. The virtuous person tends toward the good with all his sensory and spiritual powers; he pursues the good and chooses it in concrete actions." (CCC1803) Did you catch that? It says in order to be virtuous we need a habitual and firm disposition. This is where I think most men struggle. Most of us desire to do good. We desire to BE good. The problem is we don't have a system in place to form the necessary habits that shore up our will. Almost every man I have worked with over the years falls prey to this. We have the intention of being virtuous, but the road to hell is paved with good intentions, as they say. As men, we need structure and accountability to help us practice and live out virtue in our lives. Put pieces of wood for building a desk in front of a guy without directions or tools and the wood will soon be pushed to the side with a promise of getting to it later. Put that same wood in front of a guy with directions and a screw gun and he will build it in an hour. You see, the desire is there, we just need good directions.

That is what I hope these books can be for you every month. In them, you will be able to practice a singular virtue over 30 days in the different relationships of your life. This will help you dial your focus in on one virtue each month and will help keep you from feeling overwhelmed. Feeling overwhelmed is what makes most guys put something down. That's why we have made each day as simple as possible for you. We have even included the daily Gospel reading for you to read and reflect on what God is sharing with you personally that day. That in itself will help transform your life.

You also will have the opportunity to list out the ways in which you have practiced that month's particular virtue in the four different relationships in your life. Those are your relationship with God, your relationship with your spouse, your relationship with your children, and your relationship with your neighbor. These are the places

God wants us to grow in virtue. He uses the very people He puts in front of you each day as opportunities to grow in virtue and holiness. If you are not married and do not have children use those two weeks to continue to grow your relationship with God and your neighbor while praying for your future spouse and children.

The last piece we have included is the Opportunity for Grace Chart. This is not a commitment sheet but is exactly what it is called. It's an opportunity for grace. It is a list made up of simple yet powerful practices you can begin to put into place in your life. These are opportunities you can seek out throughout the month to receive God's grace or pass it along to your family or others. Most guys beat themselves up for what they don't do. This is an opportunity to shine light on the progress you are making each week in your spiritual life. It's a chance to see the positive instead of the negative.

It is my hope and prayer that you will find this simple yet powerful tool helpful. I hope that you will use this book each day to help continue on the path to holiness. If your goal is to be the man that God created you to be, then this will get you going in the right direction. I look forward to walking this journey towards becoming virtuous men beside you.

### THE VIRTUE OF PERSEVERANCE

#### Brothers in Christ,

The journey of a Christian is a long one. The promise we make to give our lives fully to Jesus at our baptism or confirmation is a lifelong promise. It is about more than just a momentary experience of conversion or a temporary feeling of closeness to Jesus. Conversion is a lifelong process, and it is one we must constantly work towards. In order to live this promise out, we need God's grace. That grace comes to us in the form of the virtue of perseverance.

Perseverance is defined as "having persistence in doing something despite difficulty or delay in achieving success." By that definition, you can see why learning to persevere is so vital to our faith. Each and every day, we are met with difficulties and struggles in our life. We face them at work, in our families, and with our neighbors. The world, the flesh, and the devil set snares and temptations for us as men at every turn. Many of these temptations and struggles can really wear a man down over time. They wish to lead us away from God and the things that we know we need to do in our lives to grow in our relationship with Him. Oftentimes, they can even lead us to a place of desolation; a place where we can't even feel God's presence in our lives. Our faith isn't about feelings, though. It's about fidelity. It's about persevering in our faith through every struggle and challenge that is laid before us. Jesus speaks of this in Luke 21:19 when he says, "By your perseverance you will secure your lives." He spoke these words right after he told the disciples they would be persecuted and hated for following him. Today, as modern-day disciples, we can expect the same thing. That means we will also have to heed Christ's words in our need for the virtue of perseverance in order to "secure" our eternal lives.

When I think of the virtue of perseverance, I think of great saints like St. Teresa of Calcutta. This may come as a surprise to many of you, but Mother Teresa claimed that she was in a desolation for over 50 years. She told people she was deprived of feeling the presence of God for most of her life and described this as a darkness. Each day, she felt God less and less in prayer, in spiritual direction, and in worship. Despite all the darkness and the feelings of abandonment, Mother Teresa continued to pray. She continued to run a religious order while living in poverty and helping thousands of the most downtrodden people on the streets of Calcutta. She remained faithful and steadfast. Even though she was met with silence in prayer and in her relationship with Jesus, she pursued Him and His will for her life each day. Mother Teresa knew that God loved her, and she persevered all those years even though she didn't feel it.

Men, we have to learn from great saints like St. Teresa. We have to learn from those in the Early Church who faced persecution, physical harm, and even death in their

pursuit of Jesus. If we are going to become and continue to be the men God calls us to be, then we are going to have to learn to persevere through all things. In the words of St. Jose Maria Escriva, "To begin is for everyone. To persevere is for saints." Our goal and our mission in life for ourselves and those around us is to become saints. This month let's meet all the trials, temptations, and tribulations head-on with our eyes on the cross. Jesus was able to persevere through all His trials throughout His passion. Through His strength, we will be able to persevere through ours. I will be praying for the grace to persevere right alongside you all this month, my brothers. Remember, you can do all things through Christ who strengthens you.

### **WEEK 1 REFLECTION:**

### PERSEVERANCE AND GOD

God loves you. Make no mistake about that. Sometimes, though, we can find ourselves questioning that. There are times in our lives where He feels distant, and we can feel abandoned by Him. These are the times when it is hard to stay on track with our faith and our spiritual practices. These times are called periods of desolation and can often be very difficult to get through. That is why we must be well-versed in the virtue of perseverance.

Through the course of our lives, we are going to have difficulties. We are going to have trials and tribulations that are very challenging for us. It is just a part of life. How we handle these challenges makes all the difference in the world. We can allow them to beat us down and choose to give up, or we can keep our eyes firmly on Christ and persevere through them with His strength. St. Paul chose to do the latter. There is a call to persevere all throughout St. Paul's letters. He implores people to endure whatever they have to for the love of God. He tells the Galatians, "Let us not grow tired of doing good, for in due time we shall reap our harvest, if we do not give up."(Gal 6:9) He tells the Corinthians, "No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it. (1 Cor 10:13) Paul didn't just speak about it, though. He lived it. Think of all the dangers Paul faced in his life. Think of all the trials he went through. He was blinded, shipwrecked, beaten, bruised, and eventually beheaded. I am sure through a lot of that Paul didn't feel like continuing on. He even begged God to remove "the thorn from his side" three times. That thorn he described was the feeling of abandonment. He even admits that he was allowed to feel it so he wouldn't become too elated with the grace God was bestowing upon him. Paul didn't want to feel the way he did in that moment, so he asked God to remove the feeling. He figured out though, that faith isn't about feelings. It is about doing the will of God no matter what. It's about persevering through the times of desolation that will surely come in our lives. If we allow our level of engagement in the faith to be governed by feelings, then we will find our faith waning. That is the danger in giving into the feelings we have in the desolate times. God calls us to depend on Him even more in those moments, whether we feel Him or not. It is in these times that we need to pray longer, harder, and more frequently. If we persevere the way Paul did, then great fruit will come from our efforts in the same way they did from his.

My brothers, even Jesus fell three times while carrying the cross. It is guaranteed we are going to fall while carrying ours. It's not about how many times we fall. It's about how many times we get back up. That's what Paul did. He got back up time and time again. That's what Christ did while carrying His cross. If we are going to be a saint, then we have to learn to persevere. Then, at the end of our life we can share in these words of St. Paul, "I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith." (2 Tim 4:7)

## PERSEVERANCE AND MY WIFE

<sup>\*</sup>If you are not married and do not have children, use this week to continue to grow your relationship with God and your neighbor while praying for your future spouse and children.

I have news for you guys. My wife and I don't always get along. My wife and I sometimes fight. I know that must come as a huge surprise to all of you being that you all have perfect marriages. Hahaha! All kidding aside, though, I think somewhere inside we all think we are supposed to have perfect marriages. Most of us probably have some idea of what the perfect marriage would look like, and you probably think everyone else but you has one. That's just not the case. Marriage isn't supposed to be perfect. There have only ever been two perfect things in this world - Jesus and his mother, Mary. No, marriage is a dance. It is a constantly changing dance that we have to put time into to learn. Sometimes you and your spouse are in perfect step together, and other times you are out of rhythm and stepping on each other's toes. It is in those times where you are out of rhythm that you need to be able to persevere.

When I was growing up, my parents had arguments. They had disagreements and differing opinions. Sure, there were some heated moments, but there was never a time that I could tell when either one of them ever truly thought of giving up on the other. It is so different today. Marriage is becoming a thing of the past to a lot of young people, and the ones who do decide to stick their toes in the waters of marriage look at it as a short-term lease with an exit clause. The words "I do" have become more of a "we'll see". That is not what marriage is meant to be. Those wedding vows are meant to be taken seriously. They are a promise to your wife and to God. Those vows were one of the only reasons my marriage survived through my addictions and mistakes. The other reason is that I have a wife that took them seriously.

No one is pretending marriage isn't difficult. Anyone who tells you that it isn't probably isn't telling you the truth. There are going to be challenges. There are going to be heated moments and times of great stress. Through it all, though, we must remember God led us to our wives. We have to remember that God wanted us to be with that person and has given her to us to nurture, care for, and protect. He was there the day we took those vows, and He is there in the difficult moments. We just have to remember the part about dying to self. We have to make the hard decision to be selfless instead of selfish. We have to be willing to put the other and what is important to them first. We must die to self. No one likes dying to self. Not getting what you want when you want it isn't fun. However, here is where we can learn the virtue of perseverance. We can learn to pick our heads up and keep moving forward. We can choose to love even though we might not feel like it at the time. We have to look at our spouse as a partner and not the opposition. When you start to look at sacrifice as an act of love for the benefit of a loving partner, your perspective begins to change. You find yourself wanting to persevere because you understand what is at stake.

The devil hates your marriage. The devil hates the family. Destroying both of them is his mission in this world. This is how he seeks to hurt God. We cannot allow ourselves to be a puppet in his play. We have to remember how much our wives mean to us and persevere together through all the things he throws at us. As Catholic men, we need to be the example of what marriage should be like. It starts with us never giving up and always persevering no matter the difficulty.

Fatherhood is one of the most rewarding things a man can ever experience in his life. To become a father is one of the greatest gifts God bestows upon a man. All of that being said, fatherhood can also be hard. Fatherhood doesn't come with a manual that takes you step by step through the things you need to know. More often than not, our education comes from on-the-job training. You can rest assured there will be mistakes along the way, but the important thing is learning from them and persevering through them.

I remember when my first child was born. I was so excited to meet Jacob. I had always dreamed of being a dad, and I had always desired to have a son. My wish was granted in October of 2009. I recall being so jazzed up the day of the scheduled C-section. I couldn't wait to put my eyes on our little boy. I can remember like it was yesterday when the nurse handed him to me all swaddled up in that blanket. He was looking at me, and I was looking at him. The rush of pure joy that came over me was indescribable. It was one of the happiest moments of my life. Later that day in the hospital, I remember holding him again. That same joy was there, but this time there was a new feeling as well. It was a feeling of fear. I remember thinking I had no idea what I was doing. I began to look at my life and how young I still was. I started thinking about how I didn't do a very good job of taking care of myself. I was in the throes of my addictions to drugs and alcohol as well. How in the world was I going to take care of this little human being? All I could think about was messing up and letting him down. For a while, I did. I let him, his sisters, and my wife down for a number of years early on in my fatherhood. Thanks to the grace of God, the love of my wife, and the virtue of perseverance I was able to right that ship.

My brothers, we are going to make mistakes as fathers. We are going to lose our tempers and our cool sometime. There are going to be some things and situations we wish we had handled differently. No father, other than our heavenly Father, is perfect. Fatherhood isn't about being perfect, though. It's about persevering in love. It's about asking God for guidance and help in being the best father you can be. It is about putting in the work in your life to learn to love the way you are called to love. It's about constantly seeking to better yourself and your faith so that you can be the example to your children you are called to be. It's about never giving up and never losing faith when things get hard. It's about taking the blows from the devil in order to protect the ones you love. It's about fulfilling your God given role as the spiritual leader of your family and getting your kids to heaven no matter the cost. That is the role of a father.
